Dear Friends in Christ: Summer 2018

I wish each of you could have the experience of serving as a Commissioner to the General Assembly of the PC(USA). The biennial assembly puts the church's belief in "the priesthood of all believers" into practice, in an orderly process of electing leaders, responding to the pressing issues of our day, setting policy, determining priorities and allocating resources for mission.

On the flight to St. Louis I struggled with feelings of being ill-equipped and under-prepared. Assigned to the Peacemaking, Immigration and International Issues committee, I hardly felt like an expert on the issues before us: political unrest in Madagascar, a humanitarian crisis in South Sudan, a proxy war in Yemen, the geopolitical complexities of the Central American triangle that contribute to the flow of migrants and asylum seekers to our borders, etc. My anxiety was alleviated once we got started. Experienced resource people at all committee and plenary sessions answered questions, provided background and helped us to reflect theologically and pragmatically. I began to trust my judgment and that of my fellow commissioners.

The most passionate debate of the week had to do with climate change and its disproportionately devastating impact on poor people. Should the PC(USA) divest from the main perpetrators of climate change—fossil fuel companies? I came prepared to vote yes, and my mind was changed during the debate. The assembly voted to retain our holdings in fossil fuel companies in order to have a voice at corporate bargaining tables to press for change.

The harrowing news of more than 2000 children ripped from their parents at the US border and incarcerated in cages unfolded while we met. The assembly overwhelming approved a resolution calling for an immediate end to this practice and the immediate reunification of families, and condemning the president's June 20 executive order that further criminalizes migration.

I'm pleased and proud to be part of a denomination that entrusts its elected representatives to discern God's will through respectful dialogue and transparent, democratic processes. I'm also happy to be home. Eight days of General Assembly meetings was plenty!

SUMMER WORSHIP NOTES

"Be filled with the Spirit as you sing psalms and hymns and spiritual songs among yourselves, singing and making melody to the Lord in your hearts, giving thanks to God at all times and for everything in the name of our Lord Jesus." (Ephesians 5:18-20)

A hymn is a poem or song of praise to God. For centuries, hymns have played an important role in the worship of God. The Book of Psalms was the hymnbook of the ancient Israelites. Early Christians continued to sing the psalms "in the light of Jesus' life, death and resurrection. Through the ages the Church added hymns and songs from varied cultures. . .accompanied by a great array of instruments. We draw from this rich repertoire singing glory to God." (Book of Order W-3.0203) The Presbyterian Hymnal, which we use every Sunday, was compiled for Presbyterians to sing their faith. Sung or prayed, the words of a hymn tell the story of God's love and grace and of our call to obedience and service.

Join us in the Chapel at 10:00 a.m. every Sunday, July 1 through September 2. Let us, together, praise God as we sing the hymns of faith to teach ourselves the truth of scripture and to proclaim God's glory. Let us worship God!

FAITH COMMUNITY NURSE NOTES

Summer is here! It is a season when many of us will take a break from our normal routine to relax and to embark on new and fun experiences. As we remember to care for body, mind and spirit, here are some Summer Safety Tips.

Heat Safety Tips

- limit staying outdoors during the hottest part of the day, from 11 AM 3 PM
- drink more liquid than you think you need and avoid alcoholic beverages
- replace salt lost from sweating by drinking fruit juices or sports drinks (check with your healthcare provider if you have any chronic medical conditions)
- pace yourself

Sun Safety Tips

- limit direct sun exposure when ultraviolet rays are most intense, from 10 AM 4 PM
- cover up to protect your skin wear lightweight, tightly woven fabric in dark colors, and a hat with a 2 3 inch brim
- use a sunscreen with an SPF of at least 15 to block out 93% of ultraviolet rays
- wear sunglasses that block out 99 100% of ultraviolet rays
- see your healthcare provider if you see a change in size, texture, shape or color of blemishes or have a sore that does not heal

Pedestrian Safety Tips

- never use a cell phone or other electronic device while walking indoors or outdoors they distract you
- only cross at designated crosswalks
- be aware of drivers when crossing the street and never rely on a car to stop
- wear bright and reflective clothing
- walk in groups whenever possible

Bicycle Safety Tips

- wear a helmet
- wear bright clothing and ride during the day
- if night riding cannot be avoided, wear reflective clothing and use a bicycle equipped with reflectors
- ride single file in the direction of the traffic and use extra care at intersections
- get acquainted with traffic laws cyclists follow the same rules as motorists

Water Safety Tips

- never swim alone
- only swim in areas supervised by lifeguards
- make sure the body of water (pool, lake, river, ocean) matches your skill level
- if you get caught in a current or riptide, do not try to fight it float with it or swim parallel to the shore until you can swim free
- wear lifejackets when boating
- never drink alcohol when swimming or boating

Faith Summer Tips

- include prayer in your daily routine
- attend Sunday worship
- visit a church member who is homebound or has been ill or having a difficult time

• share your faith with a friend or co-worker

May each of us set aside some time this summer to leave behind the activity and stress of our normal routine and tip the scales in favor of body, mind, spirit wellness!

IMPORTANT UPDATE - MEDICAL AND EMERGENCY CARE SUPPLIES AT CHURCH ON THE GREEN

- † During the recent Spring Clean-Up Day on April 29th, the Medical Equipment which is available to be loaned out to our church family and the community was thoroughly washed down and relocated from the basement to a room on the 2nd floor. Older/broken items were discarded, still leaving us with an adequate supply for anyone who has a need. A special thank you to Bob Edmond, Mala Maharaj, Eric Maciag and Scott Maciag who helped make all of this happen. We have many items, including crutches, canes, walkers, wheelchairs, commodes, bedpans, urinals, raised toilet seats and a hospital bed. If you or someone you know has a need, please contact the church office or Janice Fulton. Our only request is that items which are loaned out be returned, so they are available for someone else in need.
- † For any who are not already aware, we have an AED (Automated External Defibrillator) equipped with both Adult and Pediatric Electrode Pads. It is mounted on the wall in the hallway at the rear of the Chapel. If you need to use it, open the box mounted on the wall and remove the carrying case which contains the defibrillator. When you are done, please put the defibrillator back in the box and notify Janice Fulton that it was used, so the electrode pads can be replaced.
- † The church has had small First Aid Kits in the kitchens in the Main Building and Parish House, but in an effort to be sure that we have as many needed supplies as possible, two new and larger Class B First Aid Kits were donated. One kit is located in the Parish House Kitchen and one kit is located on the wall next to our Defibrillator in the hallway at the rear of the Chapel. If you need to use one of the kits, please remove it from the wall and place it flat on a table or the floor before opening it (or everything will fall out). When you are done, please put it back up on the wall and let the church office or Janice Fulton know if supplies need to be replaced.

We want to especially thank Scott Larson, Safety NJ LLC, for donating one of the kits. If you or a friend want to get/renew CPR or First Aid Training, or you are purchasing any first aid kits or supplies, please consider using Safety NJ.
