Clergy are accustomed to working through the month of December to make the season meaningful and beautiful for others. Breaking my ankle the day before Advent meant I could do very little of that.

My personal Advent journey was one of healing. I have marveled at the capacity of the human body to recover from trauma—by God's design—and I am deeply grateful for the medical professionals, church folk and my attentive husband through whom I've received all the care I could ask for or need.

I've never broken a bone before, let alone several all at once! But the truth is, I was broken before I fell down the stairs, and I'll still be broken after my bones heal. I try not to hide my brokenness from you in my ministry. The truth is we're all broken in one way or another. Redemption comes when we admit our brokenness and make plain our need for mercy and help. The song, "Anthem," by Leonard Cohen comes to mind:

Ring the bells that still can ring Forget your perfect offering There is a crack in everything That's how the light gets in.

In the New Year, let us be open with God and one another about our brokenness. Even more so, let us expect to be amazed at the ways God's light shines in our brokenness to heal and to save.

To paraphrase John 1:5, "the light shines in our [brokenness] and our [brokenness] did not overcome it."

Join us at 10:45 a.m. every Sunday in January to worship and praise God as we begin a New Year of work and witness in our community. As we take time to pack away the Christmas ornaments and the excitement of gift giving and receiving, it is good to know that God is with us in the ordinary, everyday moments of our lives. Listed below are some scripture texts to prepare your heart and spirit for worship as we recognize the journey of the Wise Men, the baptism of our Lord, and the ordinary time that comes between the high holy days of Christmas and Lent on the church calendar.

A reminder that God's love is steadfast in spite of our sinful nature.

Sunday, January 27 – Ordinary Time – Psalm 19

The heavens proclaim God's glory. God's perfect law revives the soul.

LET THERE BE LIGHT

It is amazing what new lights can do!! Have you been on the second floor of the education building lately? The new lights really brighten the place up! (Pun intended) We are also hoping that the ceiling lights in the worship space will be done by the time you receive this. If not, we will just wait a little longer but we are hoping this will update our space and make it more inviting and user friendly. Good things come to those who wait.

SHINE THE LIGHT CAMPAIGN
