ANNUAL MEETING

Session has called the annual meeting of the congregation for Sunday, February 3 (snow date Sunday, February 10) in the Chapel immediately following morning worship. Church leaders will review their work in 2018 and their goals for 2019. Nominees will be presented for election to Session, Class of 2021. In addition, two actions will be taken to revise our church by-laws. The first: to reduce the number of persons on the Nominating Committee from 8 to 5. The second, which has two parts: to replace "Article XIII Deacons" with the following - "Article XIII - Individually Commissioned Deacons - The congregation may elect a deacon or deacons at the annual meeting or at a special meeting of the congregation as determined by session, for a term of 1-3 years, renewable up to a maximum of 6 consecutive years. Deacons are individually commissioned to a defined ministry, ordinarily visitation, and are accountable to the session." And, in "Article XIV - Vacancies" delete the words "or the board of deacons
